Located in the Foothills of South Carolina in southern Anderson County, Crescent High School has added the South Carolina Star quilt panel to their school building. The art students under the supervision of their art teacher, Kyunga Hill, choose a *South Carolina Star* pattern for the quilt block at their school. This pattern was designed by Marcia Hohn from **Quilter's Cache** and was modified to reflect Crescent High.

"We chose the South Carolina Star pattern for our quilt design and kept the colors in line with our school colors of Black and Gold." Anderson UHQT Production team members Stamie Cline, Teri Walker, Linda Reeves, and Diane Schonauer supervised the students in painting the quilt panel and taught them how to make the fabric quilt. The students learned the basics of sewing and making the fabric quilt for their school.

Crescent High School was built in 1956 with the combination of Iva and Starr High Schools. A contest was held to name the new high school and several names made the short list including Paramount and Crescent. The name Crescent was chosen because the site upon which it was built was along the longest continuous curve in South Carolina. Crescent was also chosen because of the Crescent moon on the SC state flag. Two other area high schools, Wren and Palmetto, had also been named because of South Carolina symbols.

The first principal of Crescent High School was Mr. R. M. Stone. There were about 275 students in the 1956-57 school year. Over the years, Crescent has experienced many changes and renovations. The school's current population is around 700 and it

continues to be a school which embraces excellence and holds high expectations for its students.
